# **TBS Player Tips**

Your phone isn't the only smart device. The Talking Book Service (TBS) players were designed to be easy to use and to work well for you.

Below are a few helpful hints for using your TBS player to its fullest advantage.

Your player is smart and knows exactly where you left off in each book you are reading or have read previously. This is true even if you are switching back and forth with your cartridges or toggling back and forth between books on the same cartridge.

When your player is turned on but does not have a book in it, you can push any button and its function will be described to you.

If you want to return to the beginning of any book, push the Play/Stop button twice. It is the large, square button at the bottom of the player, in the middle.

You can use the Tone buttons (the top two buttons on the far left) to change the pitch of the narrator.

You can use the Speed buttons (the top two buttons on the far right) to adjust the speed of narration.

The Sleep button (located above the square Play/Stop button) can be used when you know that you are going to doze off while listening to your book. Push once for 15 minutes of reading before the player will shut off for you. Push twice for 30 minutes, three times for 45 minutes, and four times for 60 minutes.



# **Volunteer Spotlight -- Fred Riddle**

There are between 250 and 300 cartridges returned to the Idaho TBS on a busy day, and each case needs to be opened and checked to make sure the cartridge is in good condition before it goes back out to another patron. Fred's handy tool makes this part of the process much quicker and safer for staff and volunteers.

comes with the territory."


